- I needed more information on EthCo and what its aims were as did many others I talked to. I came with no knowledge and would have benefited from this at start.
- Resources to hand out and look at. The planning stage would only be of benefit if working with colleagues from own establishment – otherwise it is a waste of time.
- It would be good to see examples of planners or hear from teachers who have carried out one of the tasks.
- Event could be incorporated into full day event.
- Everything was excellent!
- Longer to hear further the research and more time to develop networking time.
- Excellent well done.
